## Sensei's Message

#### Obon, Obon, It's Festival Day!

Happy July everyone! It is now full-on Summer and now that it is July, you know what that means! Obon season is upon us! While I love Obon for the dancing, the food, and spending time with friends, it is also important for all of us to remember the Buddhist significance of this season.

Shakyamuni Buddha's disciple, Mogallana, was distressed to find his mother dwelling in the realm of the hungry ghosts. "How can this be?" Mogallana asked the Buddha. His mother was the best mother to him. She would always give him constant attention, make sure he had the best foods and best education. What could she have possibly done to deserve to dwell in this realm of suffering?

The realm of the hungry ghosts is a realm where we have large bellies, tiny mouths, and very thin necks. We are surrounded by large amounts of delicious looking food, but when we raise the food to our mouths, it immediately bursts into flame and turns to ash. What a horrible realm of existence to be in.

The Buddha explained to Mogallana that while his mother was wonderful to him, she was greedy and selfish towards others. She would use her power and cunning to ensure that only her son would have the best things in life and not care about anyone else. It was this greed and selfishness that caused her to be born in the realm of Hungry Ghosts. Filled with great sadness, Mogallana pleaded with the Buddha to help him free his mother from this realm.

To do this, the Buddha said, Mogallana had to provide meals and other acts of generosity towards his fellow sangha members to undo his mother's selfish acts in life. When he accomplished this task, he was able to see that his mother was freed from the realm of Hungry Ghosts. Overcome with joy, he began to dance with joy. Thus, the legend of this tradition was born.

This Obon time is a time of happiness and reflection. As we traverse this bumpy road we call life, we must reflect on our ancestors long past and endeavor to repay their kindness to us, and then to also reflect that we are constantly given wisdom and compassion by Amida Buddha from the Pure Land. As wisdom and compassion never cease in our lives, whether we can feel it or see it, truly knowing this, will also cause us to dance for joy! Namo Amida Butsu.

















