Buddhist Education Committee News






Now that the weather is cold and rainy, doesn't curling up with a book (or Kindle) sound good? How about meeting with a great group of people who have also read the book and participating in a discussion?

Look no further, the Tacoma Buddhist Temple has its own book club that was started by Rev. Kakihara in 2017. The **"Buddhism Today Reading Group**" is led by our own Minister

Assistant, Professor Erik Hammerstrom, who is a professor of Global Studies at PLU.

To date, the club has read 65 books. Authors have included Taitetsu Unno, Thich Nhat Hahn, Ruth Ozeki, Lama Rod Owens, Herman Hesse, Sharon Suh, Chenxing Han, Sallie Tisdale, and Charles Jones, to name a few.

The January book is <u>Jeff Wilson's</u>, *Living Nembutsu: Applying Shinran's Radically* <u>Engaged Buddhism in Life and Society</u>". Rev. Dr. Jeff Wilson is a professor of Religious Studies and East Asian Studies for Renison University College, at the University of Waterloo. He is the author of numerous books, including "*Living Nembutsu: Applying Shinran's Radically Engaged Buddhism in Life and Society*" and "*Buddhism of the Heart: Reflections on Shin Buddhism and Inner Togetherness*". Rev. Wilson also serves as a minister's assistant at the Toronto Buddhist Church.
